Welcome to the First Premier London Derbies Yearbook for 2019-20 season.

Hello and welcome to the first Premier London derbies year book based on the Premier London derbies (PLDs) Friday blog for the season 2019-2020. Premier London derbies are those matches played between the London Clubs in the Premier League each season. Together these Clubs and matches form what we have called the PLDs mini-league. The PLDs weekly blog (www.premierlondonderbies.com) reviews the scores, statistics and incidents in each Premier League London derby; previews the next upcoming one; and comments on topics of football interest which are current and effect football in general and our London Clubs in particular.

This first year book summarizes the results and stats of the matches between the London Clubs **Arsenal**, **Chelsea**, **Crystal Palace**, **Tottenham Hotspur** and **West Ham United** playing against one another in the PLDs mini-league for the 2019-20 season; where each is in the PLDs "all-time" league table; how each performed against the rest of the Premier League Clubs in the 2019-20 season; and where each stands in the ranking of all the Premier League Clubs in the 28 seasons of the Premier League since its inception in the 1992-1993 season. The 2020-21 season is well underway already and we shall look briefly ahead at that. Enjoy the read!

2. Overview of the Premier London Derbies season 2019-2020.

The 2019-20 season was the 28th of the Premier League and what a season it was. If nothing more it may well become known as the longest ever on record. What a season to start a football blog (www.premierlondonderbies.com) but the coronavirus Covid-19 world pandemic and Video Assistant Referee (VAR) system ensured there was no shortage of talking points.

The 2019-20 season started optimistically on Friday 9 August with a match between **Liverpool**, who were to become Champions, and newly promoted **Norwich City** who were relegated again at the end of the season. The first PLDs match of the season was a north London one between **Arsenal** and **Tottenham Hotspur** on 1 September 2019. As cases of Covid-19 rapidly increased in the New Year, and hospital admissions grew along tragically with the death toll, it became obvious that social distancing was needed to the point of a Lockdown, and mass spectator events and sports could not continue. The Premier League season was therefore paused on 7 March, restarted on 19 June, and finally finished on Sunday 26 July 2020, with a full fixture list which included **Crystal Palace v Tottenham Hotspur** as the last PLDs match of the season, almost 11 months after the first.

A season which ended without spectators in our grounds; in which the power of the TV Channels and the importance of advertising revenue became apparent; and in which livelihoods and the future of the whole "football pyramid" as we know it was threatened. If that had not been enough we also had the influence of VAR, in its first season of use in the Premier League, to contend with. It had already provided many

contentious talking points when stadiums were full, and that continued amongst the broadcasting punditry and fans during Lockdown in front of their TV screens. When we take into account the points effected by VAR decisions either awarding goals for in matches or disallowing goals against then there were potential changes for all our Clubs. **Tottenham Hotspur** benefitted the most from VAR decisions going their way, without which they would have had 6 less points and dropped 4 places to 10th and out of European football. **West Ham United** suffered most, having 5 goals for disallowed which would have given them 6 points more and put them well clear of relegation worries in 13th. **Chelsea** would have gained a point and a position making UEFA Champions League qualification more comfortable. **Arsenal** would have lost 2 points and 1 place, but qualified for the Europa League through their record 14th F.A. Cup win. **Crystal Palace** would have had 1 less point and 1 lower place with therefore less Premier League prize money.

VAR is here to stay and globally FIFA itself has taken over its running from the International Football Association Board who make football's laws, and there are changes for this season. More importantly Covid-19 is here to stay as well and although the professional game continues there are still no spectators nor any sign of when there will be.

The number in brackets shows the Club's final position in the Premier League.

Congratulations to **Chelsea** the champions of the PLDs mini-league for the second season in a row. **Tottenham Hotspur** were again second and now have more wins than defeats in the all-time PLDs ranking. **West Ham United** despite doing the double over the Blues slipped down to 5th, changing places with **Crystal Palace**. The **Arsenal** were again mid table in 3rd but with 3 points less than last season like Spurs. **Watford** were bottom of this league and relegated as next to bottom of the

Premier League, so we shall not have to decide whether they are a true PLDs Club for now.

This table includes only the Clubs in the Premier League for this season 2020-2021. Watford, relegated at the end of last season, are not usually included in a London derbies all-time record. Other London Clubs who have been in the Premier League are Charlton Athletic (10W, 1D, 5L), Queens Park Rangers (7W, 4D, 3L), and A.F.C. Wimbledon (8W, 6D, 2L). Presumably only money is likely to bring them back again.

The top three Clubs are the only ones to have been in the Premier League since its beginning in 1992, but it looks like it will always be between Chelsea and Arsenal to top this all-time record since their win percentages (win%) are so much higher than those of Tottenham Hotspur or West Ham United. Crystal Palace played their 100th

Premier League London derby in the 2019-2020 season and won their 100th point in their last match against Spurs. Fulham are back in the Premier League and will play PLDs matches again this season after their promotion as EFL Championship play-off final winners.

The number in brackets after the Club's name shows their final position in the Premier League.

Watford are included in this table and got more points from "The Rest" than **West Ham United** but were relegated. The PLDs match on 24 August 2020 after the season restart, which the Hornets lost 1-3 at home to the Hammers really was a "6-pointer". The Hammers 6 points taken from **Chelsea**, top of both this table and the PLDs mini-league, were also vital. The top 3 positions in this table are the same as in the PLDs final table but closer in points. **Tottenham Hotspur's** North London derby win made all the difference for them in the Premier League, as did **Chelsea's**

double over Spurs. **Arsenal** finished strongly in the Premier League after the restart, and with their F.A. Cup win found an easier way into the **Europa League** than Spurs in the end. **Crystal Palace** have an interestingly symmetrical record home and away, having lost momentum with the Covid-19 enforced break, and playing badly after restart. It looks overall that playing London derby matches does influence the chances of one of our Premier London derbies Clubs getting into the "top 6" for European football, winning the Premier League, or avoiding relegation.

7. London Clubs in the first 28 seasons of the Premier League (1992 to 2020).

Only 6 Clubs have played all the 1076 matches of the 28 seasons of the Premier League since its first season in 1992-93, and that includes 3 of our PLDs Clubs, Arsenal, Chelsea and Tottenham Hotspur. Of the other 3 PLDs Clubs currently in the Premier League West Ham United have played 920 matches over 24 seasons, Fulham 532 in 14 seasons, and Crystal Palace 426 in 11 seasons. The table here shows the top 10 Clubs ranked on points gained from their matches played, together with Wimbledon (316 matches in 8 seasons), Charlton Athletic (304 in 8), and Queen's Park Rangers (278 in 7), as other London Clubs who have played in the Premier League, together with Watford (226 in 7). In all 49 different Clubs have played in the Premier League, and Southampton are the only other Club to have played more than 20 seasons (810 matches in 21 seasons).

Any ranking based on points won will of course reflect the number of matches played and on this basis the "top 6" in the table is what it is. It reflects the work of a limited number of people besides the players. First and foremost is Sir Alex Ferguson, Manager of top ranked Club Manchester United between 1992 and 2013, and therefore responsible for the majority of their massive 2,234 points total. **Arsenal's** Arsene Wenger managed more Premier League matches than Sir Alex (828 v 810) over the years 1996 to 2018, and again is the main driver in their second spot. For third placed **Chelsea** the major influence in their success is Roman Abramovich's investment, with perhaps their best known Manager Jose Mourinho

only contributing to 211 of their matches in his two spells there. He is ranked 10th in the order of matches managed in the Premier League with 334. David Moyes of **West Ham United** (4th with 549) and Steve Bruce of Newcastle United (7th with 434) are the only other Managers in that top ten list still managing in the Premier League.

Such is the points gap between Manchester United and the rest that it is difficult to see them being overtaken even in the next 10 to 15 seasons unless there is a complete collapse in English football structure or investment is withdrawn from them. The much narrower points gaps between **Arsenal** in 2nd, **Chelsea** in 3rd and Liverpool in 4th may lead to changes in their positions over the next 3 to 5 seasons. Absent from the top 6 are Manchester City who have only played 23 seasons and 886 matches in the Premier League but are closing fast in points on 6th placed Everton with 1450 points won against the Toffees 1476. If, however, we look at other ways of ranking in this table City have already overtaken them and 5th placed **Tottenham Hotspur** on percentage of games played won ("Win%") and points won per game played (pts/game). Manchester United still reign supreme on all these criteria being the only Club with a Win% of more than 60% and more than 2 points per game average.

8. Goal Scorers and Assists in the Premier London Derbies season 2019-20.

Although **Chelsea** scored the most goals (20) it was **Arsenal's** *Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang* who top scored in the PLDs matches with 8 goals only one of which was a penalty. He also scored those precious 2 goals in the F.A. Cup Final v **Chelsea** and was second in the Premier League rankings with 22 goals in total. Well done and no wonder **Arsenal** wanted to keep him! Joint second were *Jordan Ayew* who scored 5 of **Crystal Palace's** 11 PLDs goals, and *Willian Borges da Silva* was **Chelsea's** top scorer also with 5 of which 3 were penalties.

The top 10, or rather top 11, PLDs scorers for the 2019-2020 season are here:

Five other players scored 2 goals each; 30 players scored a single goal each; and there were 3 own goals, all in favour of Spurs by Palace's *Patrick Van Aanholt*, the Hammer's *Tomas Soucek*, and the Blues' *Anton Rudiger*, who had a mixed season against Spurs in all. That makes 88 goals in the PLDs matches for 2019-2020.

Regards assists, for which more credit is now being given, only 3 PLDs players were in the Premier League top 20 for the 2019-2020 season being: *Heung-Min Son* (Spurs) 4th equal with 10; *Willian* (Chelsea) 11th equal on 7; and teammate *Cesar Azpilicueta* 19th equal on 6 assists. Manchester City's *Kevin De Bruyne* on 20 assists, with champions Liverpool's fullbacks *Trent Alexander-Arnold* second (13) and *Andrew Robertson* third (12).

9. Reds and Yellows in the Premier London Derbies season 2019-20.

We sometimes hear that there is more passion and commitment in the football played in the North East and North West and particularly in the great Liverpool and Manchester derby rivalries. If yellow and red cards are an indicator then in this last Premier League season there were only 3 reds, none of them for particularly heinous crimes, in the PLDs matches. One might expect David Luiz of **Arsenal** to be one of our 3 players, particularly away at his old club **Chelsea**, where he took Tammy Abraham out from behind for a straight red card and penalty. The other 2 players are more surprising being **Arsenal's** Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang for a forward's misplaced, rather than reckless, tackle on **Crystal Palace's** Max Meyer, and **Tottenham Hotspur's** Heung-Min Son. Neither player had a yellow card in other PLDs matches.

Son's red card was surrounded in drama and controversy. In a home match he was tackled by **Chelsea's** Anton Rudiger and appeared to "climb up" him with his feet when getting up. Rudiger fell as if pole-axed and Son received a straight red. Later in the game Rudiger complained to the Referee that he had heard racist chants against him. The media jumped heavily on the anti-racist stance against Spurs, but subsequent investigations by both the home Club and the Metropolitan Police led to only a visiting fan being incriminated.

If Son and Spurs were unlucky with their red card they made up for it with yellows as the table/list here shows:

Chelsea, winners of the PLDs in 2019-20 on points, top this table too with the best disciplinary record having only 15 yellows awarded against them. Only 9 players received yellows and 6 of those 2 each, one of whom was Jorginho who had the third worse record in the Premier League with 10 yellows in all. **Crystal Palace** had the second best disciplinary record with again 9 players receiving 19 yellows, but strangely the player who received most (12) in the Premier League was their Captain Luka Milivojevic. Perhaps not enough passion in PLDs matches?

Tottenham Hotspur were bottom of this mini-league with 19 home match yellows and 33 in total. 17 players were involved with Harry Winks, doing his midfield destroyer job, getting 5 to add to his 4 in the Premier League. Also on 9 yellows and

thereby joint 8th in the Premier League were Watford's Abdoulaye Doucoure and Will Hughes with the relegated Hornets second to bottom of this table too.

West Ham United and **Arsenal** were mid-table despite the Gunners' 2 red cards. The Hammers had the lowest "cards per player" score with 20 yellows between 13 players that is 1.54 each. Their highest yellows scorer in the full Premier League was Issa Diop joint 17th on 8 along with the Gunners' Alexandre Lacazette and Spurs' Moussa Sissoko, all by coincidence French. Another Gunner, Granit Xhaka, lived up to his hardman and name reputation with 10 in the Premier League but only 2 in the PLDs reviewed here.

All in all not too bad individual or Club disciplinary records, so maybe the passion goes elsewhere, but certainly not amongst the crowds after the 2019-20 season restarted.

10. The season ahead.

With the necessary extension of the 2019-2020 Premier League due to the coronavirus Covid-19 pandemic the 2020-2021 season started late on the weekend of 12/13 September 2020. A shortened new season means there has been fixture congestion already. The demands of TV broadcasting, on which football so much depends now, have led to spreading the matches over the 4 days of Friday to Monday, and mid-week too.

The PLDs matches started on the first Saturday when newly promoted **Fulham** welcomed **Arsenal** to Craven Cottage. It was not a happy return to the Premier League or PLDs for the Cottagers going down 0-3! PLDs have been coming thick and fast, and here are the fixture dates, results and Blog posting dates (www.premierlondonderbies.com) where you can read more of the season so far.
